Rising Piano Star Tanya Gabrielian Returns to Bay Area as Guest Soloist

PALO ALTO, Calif., Nov 7, 2005 – Award-winning pianist Tanya Gabrielian will highlight the Palo Alto Chamber Orchestra's December 17 concert as she returns to the Bay Area from London as guest soloist for Beethoven's towering Piano Concerto No. 5 in E-flat Major, or "Emperor" concerto.

The concert, one of a themed series titled "Emperors and Kings," will also include Schubert's Symphony No. 8 in B Minor (the "Unfinished Symphony") and selections from Leonard Bernstein's West Side Story.

This concert will take place at 8:00 p.m. at Stanford University's Dinkelspiel Auditorium.

"Our program begins with Beethoven's titanic masterpiece for piano and orchestra, the 'Emperor' concerto, featuring Tanya Gabrielian, a 2000 PACO alumna who is a rising star on the international piano circuit," said PACO Music Director Benjamin Simon, who will conduct the concert. "Next will be a string orchestra version of West Side Story, Leonard Bernstein's crowning masterpiece of the American musical theater. The concert will conclude with two movements of the beloved symphony that Schubert never finished, performed by a combined string section from PACO's top two ensemble orchestras."

About the Soloist

Tanya Gabrielian has won first prizes in the 2004 Scottish International Piano Competition, the 2003 Aram Khachaturyan International Piano Competition, and more than 20 other competitions in the U.S. Currently a Master's candidate on full scholarship at the Royal Academy of Music in London, she has

performed with many orchestras, including the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Royal Scottish National Orchestra, the New London Sinfonia and St. Martins-in-the-Field. She has been featured on Public Radio International and on live radio broadcasts in Germany.

Founded in 1966, the Palo Alto Chamber Orchestra is composed of the Bay Area's most talented and promising high school musicians chosen by competitive audition. One of the few youth orchestras in the nation devoted exclusively to chamber music, PACO has participated in many international music festivals, has toured worldwide by special invitation, and has made 15 concert recordings.
